At Harlington Lower School, we are **respectful**, **responsible** and **safe**.

You might get a certificate in assembly.

Behaviour

- ▶ DoJos are used across the school
- ▶ Younger years may want to give physical stickers which can equate to one DoJo.
- ▶ An SLT sticker = 5 DoJos
- ▶ DoJos can be given for hard work, excellent work, showing the values/manners, sports, 5 Bs
- ▶ A child each week from each class will be in the golden book
- ▶ Sports certificates from home can be shared in assembly
- ▶ Values leaves can be brought in from home to celebrate children showing the values at home
- ▶ When a whole class gets a multiple of 500 DoJos, they can choose a class treat e.g. an extra playtime
- ▶ Individual DoJos equate to rewards.

Attendance

- ▶ Staff are in school every day unless they are unwell or there are exceptional circumstances - we ask that parents do the same.

- ▶ Gates open 8:45am

Reading expectations

- ▶ Your child will bring home a fully decodable book matched to their current phonics level (from the Twinkl Rhino Readers scheme). When the children finish the phonics reading scheme they will move onto Accelerated Reader. This gives your child a banded level to choose a book from. Your child will bring home a book matched to their Accelerated Reader level, chosen from our library. Your child can change this book via the school library.
- ▶ Books will be changed once a week to give your child time to practise and build confidence. Our changing day will be on a Monday.
- ▶ We encourage you to read with your child at least 5 times a week. They don't need to read the whole book each time—just a few pages a night is perfect, and they might read the whole book two or three times across the week. Reading the same book multiple times helps with decoding, fluency, expression, and comprehension.
- ▶ Your child will also take home a “reading for pleasure” book from the library, which is for sharing and enjoying together - it may not be decodable. This will be changed in the class weekly library slot.
- ▶ Teachers will hear every child read multiple times throughout the day in phonics lessons and across the curriculum. Teachers will hear every child read individually at least once per half term. Children will also be heard by TAs and reading volunteers. Please support your child's reading by encouraging regular practice at home—it makes a big difference!

Homework

- ▶ Children are expected to read 5 times a week at home - this is the main part of their homework.
- ▶ Reception and KS1 - a Maths activity will be sent home each week on a **Thursday** and is due back in on a **Wednesday**.
- ▶ Spellings will not be sent home each week but a spelling list will be shared each half term if you wish to practise spellings with your child. They will not be tested on these.

Snack

- ▶ Year 2 - Free fruit or vegetables are available at breaktime every day.



Curriculum

- ▶ The half termly newsletter gives lots of information about the topics we look at each half term.
- ▶ English, Phonics and Maths - Daily lessons
- ▶ Other subjects - Weekly
- ▶ PE - Twice a week - Tuesday and Friday

Assessment

- ▶ Phonics Screening Check - Retakes in June
- ▶ Year 2 SATs - These are not statutory anymore, but we do use the papers as part of our assessments.
- ▶ Reading, Writing and Maths assessments

Lunches

- ▶ If you think you may be eligible for free school meals, please speak to the school office.
- ▶ School lunches can be booked online.
- ▶ Please ensure that packed lunches are healthy and nut-free.

Uniform

- ▶ Royal Blue sweatshirt or cardigan with school logo
- ▶ White shirt or polo shirt with or without school logo
- ▶ Smart, tailored grey trousers either full length or shorts, grey skirts or pinafore
- ▶ Summer alternative-Pale blue checked dress, grey skirt, grey shorts
- ▶ Plain grey or white tights or grey or white socks
- ▶ Black flat heeled school shoes (not trainers, canvas, or open toed).
- ▶ Royal blue fleece jacket with school logo for outdoor wear (optional). May be worn to and from school or at playtimes.
- ▶ **Please clearly label all items of clothing**

PE kit

- ▶ Navy or black shorts
- ▶ Blue round neck T-shirt
- ▶ Trainers
- ▶ Black or navy tracksuit bottoms and/or a black or navy hoodie may be worn for outdoor PE
- ▶ The children need to come in to school in their PE kit on our PE days - **Tuesdays** and **Fridays**
